
The 10 most under-reported humanitarian crises of 2019



n 2019, countries across the world were rocked by activists, demonstrating the potential for anyone to become or support a changemaker. Global movements have increasingly gone viral, spreading messages more quickly and widely than ever before.

With so many people taking to the streets, what about those who remained silent? And with global trends in the spotlight, has the world also paid more attention to underreported crises? In 2019, over 51 million people suffered in 10 crises away from the public eye.

We need to ask: what are the factors that contribute to the silent suffering? With the fourth global "Suffering In Silence" report, CARE calls for the global community to speak up for people in crises who are otherwise forgotten.






